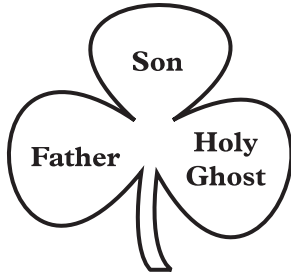

IPC Missions Conference Set For March 5th – 10th

In Acts chapter 1 before Jesus was taken from his disciples and returned to heaven he said “you shall be my witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea and Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.” Ingleside supports more than 30 ministry organizations through the missions department that are doing just that. This year IPC's missions conference is scheduled for March 5th-10th. Please consider coming out for as many of the programs as you can attend. Come out and bring your kids. See for yourself how God is moving across the world. Consider how God would have you participate in that through prayer, finances, ministry or missions.

The conference will begin on Friday March 5th with a dinner for the diaconate and the session (along with their wives) with Pastor Brian Deringer the conference's keynote speaker. On Saturday morning March 6th the men will gather and have breakfast

and hear from several missionaries who will tell about their ministries and challenges. During the meeting we will pray for their specific needs. On Sunday March 7th Brian Deringer will speak in the morning service. Additional missionary speakers will be on hand to share about their ministries in a special evening sandwich supper which will begin at 5:45pm that evening. On Monday the 8th at 7:00pm will be movie night – one for adults and the other for children. On Tuesday the 9th home fellowship groups will host a dessert fellowship at the church that will feature several missions speakers. The conference will close on Oasis Wednesday night March 10th at 5:45pm. There will be our normal supper together followed by a closing missions program featuring Brian Deringer and others. Please, make this conference a priority and come out and support as many of the activities and events as possible.
